Many people today are not sure where they fit into the scheme of things. They are searching for meaning and direction as they go through life. Michael W. Smith wrote a song several years ago, "Searching for a reason, roaming through the night to find my place in this world. Not a lot to lean on, I need Your light to help me find my place in this world."

People are confused and like Jesus said, "They are like sheep w/o a shepherd." They are wandering around trying to find where they belong. People are asking these questions: Why am I here? Where do I fit in? What is life all about? Who cares about me? Ultimately, we find these answers in the one who created us.

It is our privilege and responsibility to show and tell others how they can know Jesus and become a citizen of heaven too. Let's commit ourselves to this task. ## Benefits of being in a fellowship:

A. People experience authenticity. Authentic fellowship is not superficial. It is genuine, heart to heart, and sometimes gut-level sharing.

B. People experience mutuality. It is depending on each other. In Romans 1:12 Paul said "I want us to help each other Witt the faith we have. Your faith will help me, and my faith will help you."

C. People experience sympathy. It is not only understanding each other's feelings but it is also validating each other's feelings.

D. People experience Mercy. Fellowship is a pace of grace. Mistakes are not rubbed-in, instead they are rubbedout. 2Cor. 2:7: when people sin, you should forgive and comfort them, so they won't give up in despair.

The reality is that we are caught, living in this world but made for something more. That is also the truth of our salvation. Because we follow a savior who knew what it was not to belong. We follow a savior who got kicked out of his synagogue, whose best friends were uneducated fishermen, who went to dinner with all the wrong people, whose own parents thought him crazy, who died a criminal's death. We follow a savior who didn't belong to this world and yet who loved this world and the people in it in all its awful messiness. And from him we learn that it's only by living fully in this world that we know what it is to belong to God.

It is by living in the midst of life's problems, griefs, and general recurring chaos, day in and day out, that we learn who we really are. In the reality that is being human we learn, yet again, that no matter what happens, no matter who rejects us, no matter how many times we fall short, we do belong --- to God.

We are claimed by the arms of a love that will have us, no matter how many ways we seek to wander away, no matter how many times we seek to find our security, our sense of belonging, in some other place or person. We are claimed by the arms of an everlasting love that, of all things, finds its joy complete in us! Jesus is right. We do not belong to the world. We belong to God and His Church.
